

How Much Time?

Congaree is more pit-stop than destination. Stop in, walk the Boardwalk, join a ranger program if possible, and head on your way.

Now, if you want to get cypress-knee deep into

the park, then the best thing you can do is paddle. Cedar Creek is a good choice. Cache a car or a bike like I didat South Cedar Creek and you have a nice leisurely paddle from Bannister Bridge. Paddling the Congaree River is another option.

Need to Know

- Reservations are required for camping. Campgrounds are walk-in, tent-only.
- Reservations are also required for the firefly show. I've heard mixed opinions on it.
- Check the <u>park website</u> for current ranger programs.
